

"Platé...The Mediterranean Utopia" is the theatre performance for classic stages, indoor and open spaces of AteliercuncheoN, theatre group from Italy, produced by the Khabarovsk Young Spectator State Theatre (Russia). The performance is addressed to all kinds of publics with a particular attention to the youngest one, and it can be entirely performed in Italian, English, Russian, French and Spanish language.

The mains sources of this work come from the book "Platero y yo", written by Juan Ramon Jimenez and the homonym musical composition of Mario Castelnuovo-Tedesco. The richness of these bases have given to AteliercuncheoN the possibility to discover and touch with its theatrical language essential and sometimes forgotten themes inside the formation of all humans:—The importance of the simplicity, combined with its interesting synonyms as nature, beauty and importance -The sense of time; for the human being, as the religious time in the calendar of the sacred celebrations; and for the nature, as the alternation of day and night and the seasons -The relation between the one and the group, focusing on the positive and necessary value of the loneliness, against the forced homologation of our era - The endless contrast between spiritual and material.



The actors through their body techniques like the traditional use of the mask, the dance and the dramatic construction of the actions, together with the fine sound of the live music coming from different traditions of Mediterranean sea, will convert the poetry into an active method to watch the worldwide, into a powerful and, at the same time, delicate tool to communicate with the spectator's feelings, to approach the sensible intimate world of theirs associations, to open a dialogue through the palette of creative images of the performance. The public will be guided into a multi prospective journey towards the discovery of the Poetic, as the reconnection of ourselves with the amazing simplicity in the nature...as an actual necessity in our existence.
